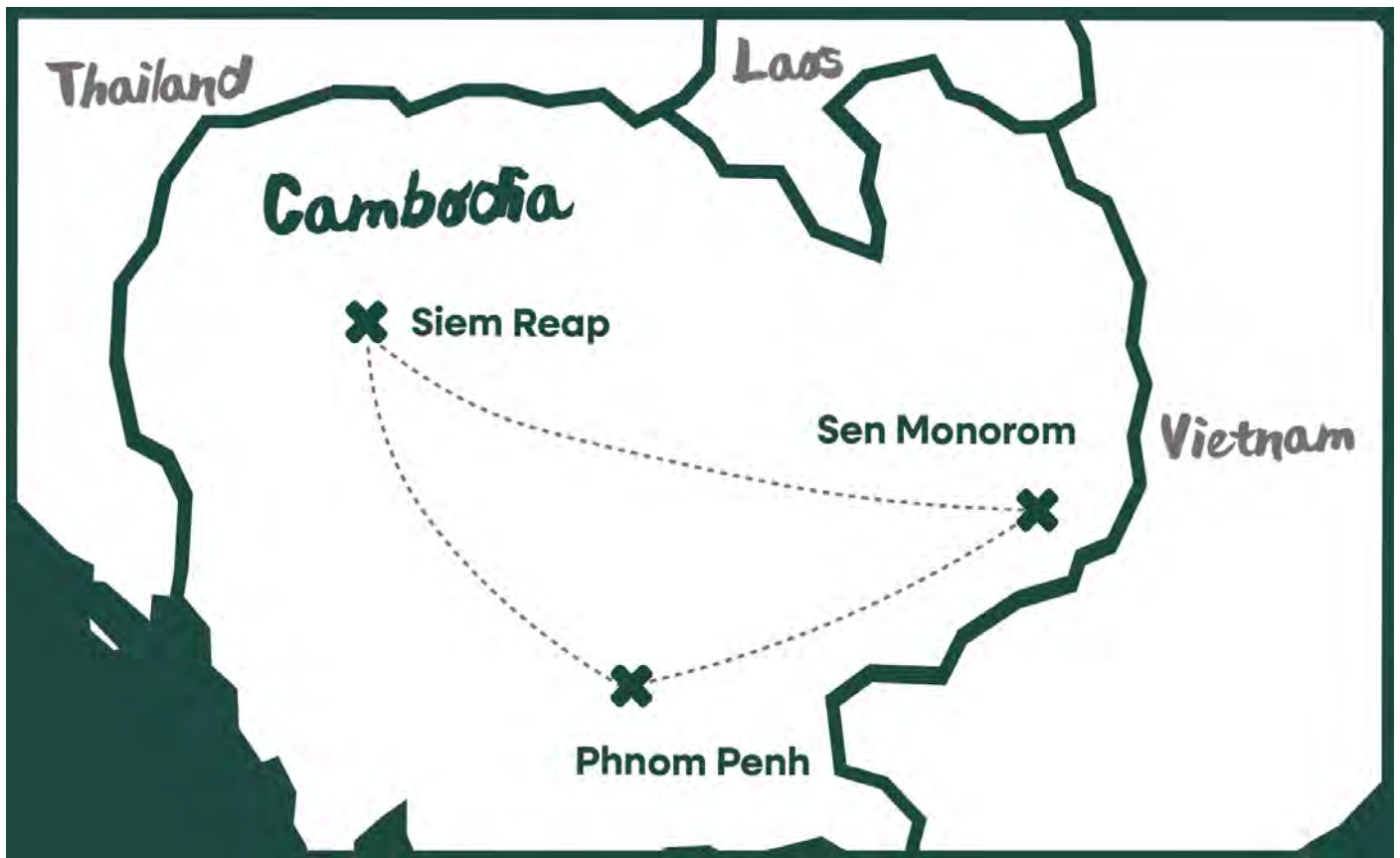

- Interact with rescued Asian elephants in their natural jungle habitat, learning about their welfare and monitoring their behaviour.
- Support Sun and Moon Bears at a world-class wildlife reserve where you will assist with food preparation and rehabilitation efforts.
- Explore ancient wonders with a sunrise visit to the legendary Angkor Wat and a boat trip through traditional floating villages.
- Immerse yourself in culture through night market visits, meditation sessions with monks, and traditional cultural shows.

Conservation Work

- Elephant Welfare:
Track movements, perform health assessments, and observe natural behaviours.
- Bear Sanctuary:
Prepare specialised diets and enrichment activities for Sun Bears and Moon Bears
- Participate in reforestation and trail maintenance within the jungle reserve

Food/Accommodation

- Three meals/day (all diets catered for)
- Drinking water

Dual-impact Conservation and Culture

A high-impact, two-species conservation journey that balances welfare work for rescued elephants and bears with deep, expert-led immersion into Cambodia's ancient soul and modern culture. Spend time in both the jungle and Cambodia's thriving modern cities, for a dramatic contrast of being 'off-grid', in ancient temples, and on the bleeding-edge of urbanisation in Southeast Asia.



Days 1 - 2

Arrival & Journey to the jungle

Fly into Phnom Penh Techo International Airport (KTI) where you'll be met by our staff on arrival before being transferred to your accommodation.

Meet the team and get to know the other teen participants over dinner at a local restaurant.

On Day 2, you will have breakfast at your hotel before travelling by bus to the remote Sen Monorom reserve (about six hours by bus).

At the reserve you will complete your placement induction on arrival before being given a guided tour of your new jungle home.



Day 3 - 6

Elephant Welfare & Jungle Treks

Spend your first week deep in the jungle performing a variety of different tasks.

You'll learn elephant tracking, assist with observations, and hike alongside rescued elephants. Your afternoons will be spent on vital conservation tasks like reforestation and trail maintenance to protect the ecosystem.

Your evenings will include free time to rest and relax and a meal on the reserve prepared by your private chef.

Day 6 concludes with a jungle trek to a waterfall and learning about the Bunong farming practices. Round off your jungle experience with a movie night, featuring a documentary about elephants.

Day 7-9

Temples & Floating Villages

Travel to Siem Reap by bus (approx. six hours) to experience Cambodia's world famous landmarks.

Explore the floating villages of Tonle Sap by boat and watch the sunrise over Angkor Wat, before a full day of exploring.

Includes a visit to the local PHARE Circus and night markets.



Days 10-11

Capital Culture & History

Return to Phnom Penh for a deep dive into Cambodian heritage.

Visit the Royal Palace and Tuol Sleng Genocide (Security Prison 21) Museum, take a night walking tour of the Independence Monument, and join monks for a peaceful meditation session.

Visit more traditional markets, including the Russian Market (Phsar Toul Tom Pong).



Days 12-13

Bear Conservation & Farewell

Travel to a wildlife reserve near Phnom Penh to work with Sun Bears, Moon Bears, and Asiatic Black Bears.

Learn about animal trafficking and support with rehabilitation and food preparation.

Hide treats in enclosures (known as 'enrichment') to keep the animals entertained and exercising their natural instincts.

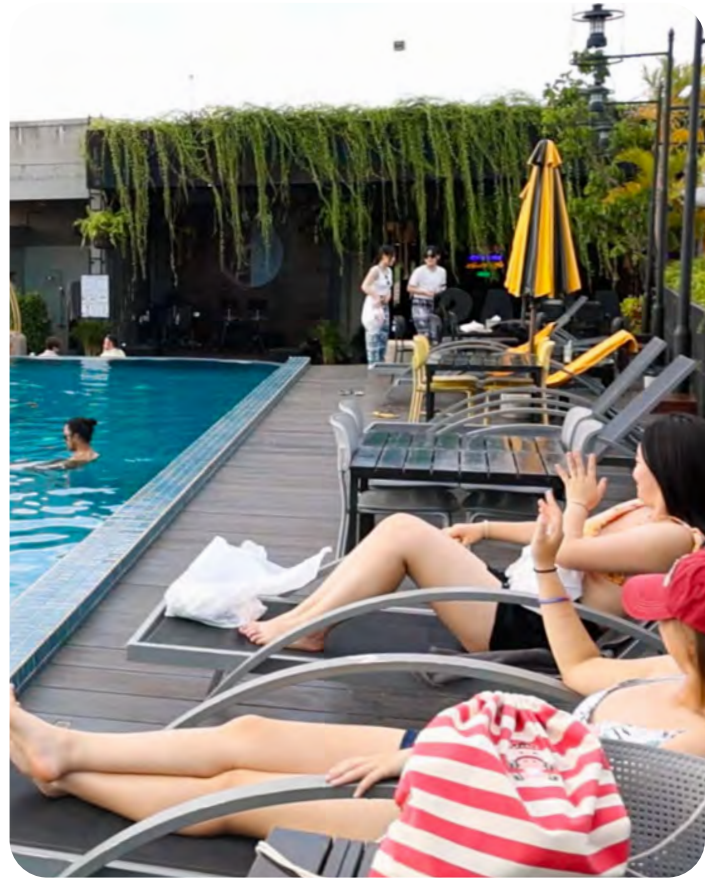
Day 13 ends with a celebration of your journey over traditional farewell dinner and karaoke party.

Day 14

Departure

Reflect on your impact and the memories made as you transfer back to the airport for your flight home.

As you pack your bags, think about your new found confidence, skills, and memories from your journey — you'll be taking these home too.
